Ishikawa Earthquake Response: At Tokyo Union Church we have responded to the Noto Peninsula earthquake disaster by making gifts to three practical and immediate emergency responses.

- 1) Uchinada Bible Church Christian relief center. This large church in Ishikawa is the gathering and distribution center for local churches to share resources and relief efforts. They are "hands on" and "feet on the ground" in the immediate area, also coordinating the efforts of local volunteers.
- 2) 2nd Harvest Japan providing food for evacuated survivors in the affected area. 2nd Harvest is our local expert at distributing large amounts of food to large groups of people in need. We are pleased that our own TUC member, Hitomi Yokote, is the new CEO of 2nd Harvest Japan.
- 3) World Vision Japan providing psychosocial support for the children, including play time and space. This is the same support we provided for children in Ukraine last year. This also provides good childcare while parents need to take care of other responsibilities.

In addition to these immediate responses, we continue to pray and seek long-term ways to support the survivors of this tragedy.
